DAY ONE

Understanding the Kingdom as a 'Son'

Romans 8:15

For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear, but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, "Abba! Father!"

Romans 8:15 is the premise that allows the believer to confidently say they are a **CHILD** of God. Paul expounds through his letter to the Roman church that salvation through Jesus Christ does not just save the believer from eternal damnation, it grafts the believer into the fullness of the Kingdom. The fullness of the Kingdom specifically includes the ability to refer to Yahweh as more than God, as Father. The Aramaic word for father: "Abba" is a deeply intimate one and it conveys the deepest level of personal relationship.

Personal relationship is how we can be certain we are truly sons of God! That's the whole reason Jesus died, and the veil in the temple was torn. Jesus died so you and I can have direct access to God.

When we take the lens of religion and the idea of "doing" out of our walk with God; when we truly understand that God is our "daddy", the one who loves us, deeply cares for us, and is invested in our well-being in every way, then we're closer to coming into a deep-rooted understanding of Kingdom Inheritance.

Often the issue to possessing what God has for us, is believing that He truly serves in that Father role in our lives. When we fail to properly see God as Father, we manifest identity issues. The enemy will often use poor examples of natural fathers to prevent us from truly grasping the goodness of our heavenly father Yahweh.

To recognize if you're dealing with any identity issues ask yourself these questions:

1. Do I believe God is **MY** Father?
2. Do I believe God will give me only the best things He has for me?
3. Do I believe God cares about me in an intimate way, for example that he cares about my hurts, pains and the petty activities of my day?

If you answered no to any of those questions, then the foundation is not solid enough for an inheritance. Those that come to God must first believe that HE IS... good, faithful, kind, able, loving, Abba etc... before God can reward them (through inheritance for their belief).

DAY TWO

Understanding the Kingdom as an Heir

Luke 12:32

32 Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom.

Romans 8:17

and if children, then heirs — heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if so it be that we suffer with Him, that we may be also glorified together.

Luke 12:32 lets us know that our Father Yahweh DESIRES, and takes pleasure in giving us the Kingdom. The Kingdom is the fullness of everything that God intended for Earth: resources, systems, mindsets, and dominion. Paul comes behind Luke 12:32 with Romans 8:17 and gives us additional language for what it means to be given the kingdom. Paul says we are HEIRS, heirs of God and joint Heirs with Christ. An heir is the person that receives what originally belonged to the Father. An heir does not earn, but by way of their bloodline inherits what belongs to their lineage. It was essential to establish that God is good Father in 'Day One' because it is through the Fatherhood of God that we can receive the fullness of the inheritance.

If God is not our Father, then we have no legal right to claim what belongs to God as our own.

Psalm 24:1

1 The earth is the LORD'S, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein

Everything in Earth belongs to the Lord, so if we try to possess anything, we must have some kind of legal claim to it. In the natural, when a Father passes, in order for the children to claim his estate or property, they must prove that they are his legal children. A stranger off the street can't just walk in and take what originally belongs to the Father.

So is the case with the Kingdom. Except this time, our Father's not dead, He's eternal and He still gives us everything that belongs to him.

Through Jesus Christ, the first son of the begotten, we get to claim God's Fatherhood, but we also get access to Jesus' heirdom. God gave Jesus everything in the Kingdom because Jesus did what no man could do (die on the cross). We don't have to die physically on the cross, but dying to the desires of our flesh allows us to also partake in the Glory (inheritance) of our bridegroom Jesus.

DAY TWO CONTINUED

Often we can understand sonship: the death and resurrection of Jesus on the cross giving us salvation and the ability to call God "Abba" but we struggle with heirdom.

Heirdom is defined as: the ability to possess what belongs to the Father because we are sons. We struggle with heirdom because we often believe that to get what belongs to God, we must earn it.

We confuse God's systems with the world's systems. The world teaches us to get anything we must "earn" it. We must put in the work, and after putting in the work if we do a good enough job, THEN we can get what we're working for.

That's not the way of the Kingdom at ALL. God says, because you are a son and you BELIEVE in Him, then it's His pleasure to give you what's His. We did not earn our salvation, nor can we earn anything else our Father has for us. The only work that we must do as sons is the work of obedience. We must be led by the spirit of God and forsake all other spirits.

To determine if you struggle with the idea of receiving and not earning, ask yourself these questions:

1. Do I believe I am worthy of the blessings of God?
2. Do I believe I can receive from God without 'doing' anything to earn it?
3. Do I believe if I simply obey God, everything good will come to me at God's timing?

If you answer no to any of these questions, you may struggle with your understanding of heirdom according to scripture. If you're not fully convinced you're an heir, then you won't fully receive because you will always impede the blessings that God freely desires to lavish upon you.



DAY THREE

Understanding Kingdom Possessions



Psalm 24:1

1 The earth is the LORD'S, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.

Genesis 1:26

26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.



Everything in Heaven and on Earth belongs to the Lord. We understand from Day One that God is our Father, Day two taught us that we receive from our Father because we're family, not because we 'earn it'. Day Three is all about understanding what exactly we're receiving? The long and short answer: EVERYTHING.



If we can conceive it with our minds, and the spirit of God allows it, we can possess it. Genesis 1:26 paints the picture of God's original thought regarding man. God desires that man have DOMINION over the fish in the sea, birds of the air, animals of land and anything that creepeth upon the Earth. This is what theologians affectionately refer to as the dominion mandate. To have dominion means to rule, or to exercise jurisdiction over. From the beginning, God wanted us to rule on the Earth as the apex of His creation. When you think of rulership, what do you think of? Hopefully you're thinking of Kingship and monarchy.

DAY THREE CONTINUED

That's why 1 Peter 2:9 refers to us as a Kingdom of priests. Another way to say this is that we are Kings that operate from our priestly office. A priest is simply one who serves as the steward of a God. Priests minister to God. Kings are the people that rule over territories and governments. When we say that we are Kings that operate from our priestly office, this means that as we minister to God, He allows us to rule over territories and governments. When we talk about territories and governments, this is both natural and spiritual.

A territory isn't just a natural piece of land, it can also refer to an industry, a field of study, anything governed by the same set of laws/regulations. An example of both a physical and spiritual territory is Hollywood. We know Hollywood is a physical city in California; spiritually, Hollywood is headquarters for the global industry of media. God says if believers will rise as Kings/Priests, He will give them territories like Hollywood to govern. This looks like righteousness flooding the media industry like never before!

Prosperity and dominion are God's heart for the believer that is properly aligned. Poverty is not the heart of God for His children, and neither is ignorance. So many believers lack the wisdom to conquer in their God-given territories because they're ignorant of their sonship, heirship or their kingdom possession.

To understand if you're rightly possessing what God has given to you, answer these questions:

1. Do I know what territories God has given me (spiritually, physically, both?)
2. Do I have a God-given plan to conquer the territories He's assigned to me?
3. Do I understand the mandate for dominion, or the WHY God needs me to conquer these territories for the Kingdom?

If you answered "No" to any of these questions, then you're likely not in a position to benefit the Kingdom of God. The kingdoms of this world have now become the kingdoms of our Lord and His Christ. We all have a part to play, and our obedience requires us to get into position. The correct position will bring prosperity to us personally, AND it will bring prosperity and glory to the Kingdom of God!
